Good News # 1: We are done with the design stage of our renovation project and are moving on to the bidding stage. We should be under construction in January with the project completed in May or June.

Good News # 2: 70% of the funds needed for this project are already raised and so the Grand Island Public Library Foundation has announced a fundraiser with a \$500,000 goal. The entire project is being financed WITHOUT City tax funds.

Design work has been intensive, resulting in several “just-in-time” improvements from our last newsletter. One improvement is to the front entryway. It not only extends out, but now blends better with the brick column bases. In addition, we are replacing the sliding doors with regular doors that are ADA accessible. This means a warmer lobby in the winter!



Once inside the lobby, we’ve come up with a simple but significant change. We will be creating three “Meet Up” areas. These areas will be reserved for groups that may not want to book a meeting room or use a study room. We are a community gathering space and we have a lot of “meet up” use already. With this simple change, this convenience space will have a more purposed use.

2018 Library Renovation Project

The Grand Island Public Library convened a long range planning committee in 2011/2012 to produce **GILIBRARY 2020** as guidance for addressing changing uses of our facility and community needs for future library services. The library is also a continuing partner in the **Grow Grand Island** initiative.

This renovation also addresses spaces and technologies that weren't fulfilled in our 2005/2007 expansion but are now possible with additional private funding sources and an easily-adaptable building.

Goal: Reinvesting in Improved Parking and Plaza

- easier and safer access for ADA and other parking, pedestrians and bike riders
- public art space in new plaza
- outdoor youth and family discovery area
- extension of entrance out into plaza

Goal: Reinvesting in Improved Meeting and Study Spaces

- lobby space repurposed for "meet-ups" and meeting room reception area
- improved technologies in meeting rooms
- two additional meeting spaces: conference room on north side of lobby for videoconferencing and small group meetings, and east side conference room
- additional quiet study/collaborative spaces
- two test proctoring rooms

The Grand Island Public Library was formed in 1884 and since 1974 has been housed in the Edith Abbott Memorial Library, 211 North Washington Street, Grand Island. This 25,000 SF facility was expanded to 49,000 SF in 2005/2007.



Goal: Reinvesting in Teens and Makerspace

- creation of Community Makerspace with high tech equipment for teen and adult STEAM learning
- updated teen spaces
